

CHALET RASCARD, FRANCE






BEDARRA ISLAND RESORT, AUSTRALIA

WADIGI ISLAND, FIJI

A mere 10 minute helicopter ride from Nadi International Airport, the only other inhabitants of the island are the gracious staff of nine, headed up by your hosts Jim and Tracey Johnston. Your private chefs, maids, hostess and boat captain are waiting to pamper you - but will make themselves scarce so you can enjoy total serenity in one of three deluxe suites perched enchantingly on the island bluffs. The stunning seascape can be enjoyed while soaking in your luxurious bath with landscape windows. But don't waste a thought on modesty - the only living things in view are seagulls and a vast expanse of endless blue waves stretching in every direction. Gardens groomed to perfection and two exquisite. beaches with vibrant turquoise lagoons will let you bask in utter peace and solitude.
